Integrity of the Game vs Economic (Politics) Impact, The Oklahoma Business Model

Friday, Feb 23, I had an onsite visit with Agent Orquiz at the Oklahoma Attorney General's OKC office in questioning a youth sport business culture that I believe strengthens a RICO out of the State of Florida's AG Office. As we have discussed in the past and your effort to submit a letter personally to the OK AG's Office I felt I needed to submit an online "Consumer Complaint" so that anything you may have submitted will have an official complaint on file. I received email notification within 48 hours that my complaint was forwarded to the appropriate department but have had no followup conversations. Today, I made contact with Agent Orquiz (405) 522-1234 and she was unable to follow up with any status.

My State Representative or Senator has the ability to further research the status of my filed complaint and possible followup with a ruling. Per Agent Orquiz one would need to contact the "Grand Jury" office, Jimmy Harmon or Gaylord Gieger, for an update or additional information.
