1. Multiple Inspections by Category:

From the dataset reviewed, some businesses in the **Processor, Grower, and Dispensary** categories did receive **multiple inspections**. These inspections often occurred as part of compliance follow-ups or occupancy checks.

• Processor Category:

 NFUSE LLC underwent at least two recorded inspections, with fees paid each time (2023 and 2024). The inspections were related to compliance and the continuation of operations without any violations noted.

• Grower Category:

 ELEVATED PEAK FARMZ, LLC had multiple inspections and continued operations without issues. GYULETRAN GREEN LLC had an inspection but did not receive occupancy, which might suggest follow-up inspections or re-inspection after resolving occupancy issues.

• Dispensary Category:

 ROOTS DISPENSARY LLC and J & K DISPENSARY both had recorded inspections. In the case of J & K, the business failed to secure occupancy, which could explain multiple inspection reports within the same period.

2. Follow the Money: MMJ Fee Payments

The MMJ fees collected from these businesses seem to follow a pattern:

- Fees Paid: Each business paid fees ranging from \$1,500 to \$6,000, depending on their license type and operational scope. Some businesses, such as **HARVEST 5, LLC**, paid higher fees, likely due to their size or the complexity of their operations.
- Inspection Fees: It's not always clear from the available documents whether all fees
 were deposited into the General Fund or whether some were allocated to special
 accounts (e.g., enforcement, safety checks, or administration). However, the standard
 practice is for most fees to go into the City's General Fund, supporting various city
 operations.

3. Inspection Patterns

- Occupancy-Related Inspections: Businesses that were flagged as "No Occupancy"
 were likely subjected to multiple inspections. For example, J & K DISPENSARY paid
 fees and had inspections, but it failed occupancy. This indicates that the city may have
 performed follow-up inspections to monitor compliance after addressing the initial failure.
- Fee Collection for Violations: There are no clear cases of violations leading to fines or additional fees beyond the standard MMJ fees. However, multiple inspections were

typically part of a process for businesses either attempting to secure occupancy or maintain compliance with state and local regulations.

4. Paper Trail: Where Did the Funds Go?

From the review of the **MMJ** fees and **inspection outcomes**, it appears that the fees collected likely followed the standard procedure of being deposited into the **City of Shawnee's General Fund**. Here's how the process likely unfolded:

- 1. **Fee Collection**: Businesses paid fees for inspections and license renewals.
- General Fund Deposits: These fees would be deposited into the city's General Fund, where they could be used for general city services (e.g., public safety, administrative costs).
- 3. Audit or Reporting Gaps: There are no detailed public reports that break down exactly how much of the MMJ fees were allocated toward specific projects like **public safety enforcement** or **opioid abatement**. However, based on standard practice, the General Fund would encompass these revenues without detailed earmarking.

Recommendations for Detailed Paper Trail Tracking:

To provide a complete analysis and ensure transparency, I recommend:

- Requesting detailed financial reports from the City of Shawnee, specifically regarding MMJ revenues and how those funds were allocated post-collection. This could include reviewing city budgets, audit reports, or special fund reports if such accounts exist.
- Documenting each inspection and follow-up with more granularity, focusing on whether re-inspections were tied to the same fee payments or led to additional costs for the businesses.

Conclusions from the Data

- The **money trail** for MMJ fees is likely tied to the General Fund, with limited transparency on exactly where the funds were allocated once received.
- **Multiple inspections** were common, especially for businesses flagged for compliance or occupancy issues, but no major fines or violations were reported in the dataset.
- Further **audits or public financial reports** will be necessary to fully trace how these funds contributed to specific city projects or initiatives.
