Hello,

I am providing the attached **Hidden Valley - Integrity of the Game USSSA Facility Report for Bentley Sports Complex**. The report is part of the Oklahoma USSSA Research Dataset covering 2001-2026 and organizes publicly available USSSA tournament and league information into a consistent facility-level analytical framework. It separates direct stand-alone activity associated with Bentley Sports Complex from multi-facility records in which the Primary Facility appears with additional playing locations, and then combines those populations into a broader documented activity footprint.

How the Financial Measure Is Developed

Number of Participating Teams x Publicly Posted Team Entry Fee = Calculated Team Entry Fees. The calculation is applied at the event-record level and then aggregated for analysis. These figures are analytical measures of documented economic activity. They are not, by themselves, proof of actual collections, gross receipts, facility or municipal revenue, director compensation, profit, taxable income, gate or concession revenue, distributions, or disposition of funds.

Pages 1-2 - Direct / Stand-Alone Bentley Sports Complex Activity

The conservative direct population contains records identifying **Bentley Sports Complex independently** as the event facility. The report identifies **\$3,146,496** in Calculated Team Entry Fees, including **\$2,469,394 baseball** and **\$677,102 softball**. This population represents **3,195 teams**, **9,154 minimum games**, and **708,280 minimum officials**, with one facility, one municipality, and one county. The municipality displayed is **Bixby**. League Teams are reported as **No data**, while League Team Entry Fees are displayed as **\$0.00**.

Direct Tournament Director Concentrations

The direct director chart is led by **Lynn Gibson - \$2.24M**, followed by Susan Gibson \$442.93K, Rick Glasser \$207.01K, Jace Sanchez \$147.10K, Keith Kirk \$44.05K, BIG Show Productions \$31.09K, Wally Fortuna \$18.21K, Bob Lomax \$6.64K, and Julie Dingle \$5.30K. These figures describe Calculated Team Entry Fee activity associated with the displayed director categories; they do not establish personal receipts or compensation.

The Page 1 scorecard reports **6 directors**, while the chart visibly displays nine named director categories. The summary preserves both source observations rather than silently reconciling the discrepancy. If an exact unique-director count is required, the underlying event-level dataset should be reviewed.

The baseball series is: **2026 \$83.22K; 2025 \$142.00K; 2021 \$2.63K; 2020 \$65.84K; 2019 \$183.52K; 2018 \$196.84K; 2017 \$215.04K; 2016 \$238.62K; 2015 \$230.63K; 2014 \$235.37K; 2013 \$235.11K; 2012 \$196.75K; 2011 \$157.30K; 2010 \$144.35K; 2009 \$74.79K; and 2008 \$67.40K.** The highest displayed baseball season is **2016 at \$238.62K.**

The softball series displayed is: **2026 \$124.54K; 2025 \$53.66K; 2021 \$4.10K; 2020 \$48.94K; 2019 \$56.23K; 2018 \$62.01K; 2017 \$73.75K; 2016 \$70.33K; 2015 \$56.15K; 2014 \$49.66K; 2013 \$21.76K; 2012 \$29.66K; and 2011 \$26.32K.** The highest displayed softball season is **2026 at \$124.54K.**

Page 3 - Associated Multi-Facility / Satellite Activity

Page 3 excludes the stand-alone Primary Facility population and examines records in which Bentley Sports Complex appears with one or more additional facilities. The associated population identifies **\$417,270** in Calculated Team Entry Fees, including **\$398,571 baseball** and **\$18,699 softball**. It represents **130 teams, 680 minimum games, 45,280 minimum officials, 4 facilities, 2 directors, 2 municipalities, and 1 county.**

The largest displayed facility combinations include **Bentley Sports Complex + Owasso Park South - \$53.88K; Bentley Park Sports Complex + Indian Springs Sports Complex + OBrien Park + Owasso Park South - \$53.54K; Bentley Park Sports Complex + Sand Springs Youth Baseball - \$45.21K; and Bentley Sports Complex + OBrien Park + Owasso Park South + Price Fields - \$31.94K.** Additional combinations connect the Bentley facility naming categories with Jenks, Tulsa Hilti Park, Owasso Park North, Carl Smith Sports Complex, Anthis Brennan Sports Complex, Sapulpa High School, and other locations. Each displayed amount is one pool of activity associated with that multi-facility configuration.

The Page 3 director chart is led by **Rick Glasser - \$259.21K**, followed by Lynn Gibson \$127.80K, Jace Sanchez \$17.22K, Wally Fortuna \$11.56K, and Tulsa Girls Softball Federation \$1.48K. As with Page 1, the Page 3 scorecard reports **2 directors** while the chart visibly displays five named director categories; this source inconsistency is preserved rather than silently corrected.

Page 4 - Combined Documented Facility Activity Footprint

Combining direct and associated activity produces a **\$3,563,766** documented facility activity footprint, including **\$2,867,965 baseball** and **\$695,801 softball**. The combined population represents **3,325 teams, 9,834 minimum games, 753,560 minimum officials, 5 facilities, 7 directors, 3 municipalities, and 1 county.**

The combined director chart is led by **Lynn Gibson - \$2.37M**, followed by Rick Glasser \$466.22K, Susan Gibson \$442.93K, Jace Sanchez \$164.32K, Keith Kirk \$44.05K, BIG Show Productions \$31.09K, Wally Fortuna \$29.77K, Bob Lomax \$6.64K, Julie Dingle \$5.30K, and Tulsa Girls Softball Federation \$1.48K. The direct Bixby category remains the dominant municipality concentration at approximately \$3.15M, while multi-facility records extend the documented footprint into additional municipality combinations.

Methodology & Interpretation

The report's controlling principle is **Association is not allocation**. A multi-facility record establishes that the listed facilities were associated with the same event, but it does not establish how teams, games, officials, entry fees, or other activity were distributed among the individual locations. The full value of a combination must therefore not be assigned to every listed facility. Separate facility reports also should not simply be added together to produce statewide totals because the same event can appear in multiple facility reports; statewide aggregation requires event-level deduplication.

League Activity & \$0.00 Fee Limitation

The direct report displays **League Teams: No data** and **League Team Entry Fees: \$0.00**. Consistent with the Hidden Valley methodology, the \$0.00 public value is preserved rather than replaced with an unsupported estimate. The public record alone does not establish whether a zero-dollar listing reflects a free event, locally administered fee, league structure, missing historical information, or another circumstance.

Key Takeaway

Bentley Sports Complex has a substantial documented USSSA activity footprint dominated by baseball. The direct stand-alone population identifies **\$3.146 million** in Calculated Team Entry Fees associated with **3,195 teams**, of which approximately \$2.469 million is baseball. Associated multi-facility records identify another **\$417,270**. Together, the two populations form a **\$3.564 million combined documented activity footprint** associated with 3,325 teams. The annual series shows sustained activity across the displayed 2008-2026 seasons, with 2016 the highest total and baseball season and 2026 the highest displayed softball season.
