Executive Summary

The report identifies **Hafer Park / A C Caplinger Sports Complex** as the Primary Facility. For stand-alone records, it displays **\$1,242,418.00** in Calculated Team Entry Fees, all baseball, with no softball Calculated Team Entry Fees. The direct population contains 8,995 teams, 19,584 minimum games, 1,347,640 minimum officials as displayed, eight directors, one municipality, and one county. League activity includes 932 teams and \$28,509.00 in League Team Entry Fees.

Director Concentration

Page 1 displays Terri Jungels at approximately **\$1.14M**, followed by Ted Cox (\$53.24K), Jeffery Ludlam (\$34.27K), Scott Marwitz (\$10.2K), Lynn Gibson (\$5.99K), Scott Nelson (\$1.89K), Marie Gassaway (\$840), and Wally Fortuna (\$0). These are calculated activity concentrations associated with director records, not findings of income or receipt of funds.

The highest individually labeled season is **2005 at \$91.50K**, narrowly above 2010 (\$91.22K) and 2006 (\$90.55K). Total and baseball values are identical because no softball activity is displayed. The chart also contains an aggregated **Others** category of \$43.55K; its component seasons cannot be determined from the report.

Associated Multi-Facility Activity

Page 3 excludes stand-alone Primary Facility records and displays **\$52,712.00** in associated multi-facility Calculated Team Entry Fees, all baseball, with 258 teams, 549 minimum games, 40,640 minimum officials, two facility combinations, four directors, two municipalities, and two counties.

Association is not allocation. Each amount above is one pool of activity associated with the complete facility combination. The report does not establish how teams, games, officials, fees, or other activity were distributed among the individual locations.

Combined Documented Facility Activity Footprint

Page 4 combines direct stand-alone records with associated multi-facility records. The broadest documented footprint is **\$1,295,130.00** in Calculated Team Entry Fees, all baseball, with 9,253 teams, 20,133 minimum games, 1,388,280 minimum officials, eight directors, two municipalities, and two counties.

The combined municipality chart displays approximately **\$1.28M** associated with Edmond and \$17.92K with the Edmond/Stillwater combination. The combined director chart is led by Terri Jungels at approximately **\$1.17M**, followed by Ted Cox (\$67.28K), Jeffery Ludlam (\$36.37K), Scott Marwitz (\$10.2K), Lynn Gibson (\$5.99K), Scott Nelson (\$1.89K), Marie Gassaway (\$840), and Wally Fortuna (\$0).

Methodology & Limitations

Pages 1-2: direct activity where the Primary Facility is listed independently. **Page 3:** associated activity where it appears with additional facilities. **Page 4:** the combined documented footprint. Multi-facility totals must not be assigned in full to each listed facility, and separate facility reports should not simply be summed because the same event may appear in multiple facility reports.

The dataset is an independent research reconstruction based primarily on publicly accessible USSSA event, tournament, league, director, facility, team, pricing, and related historical information. Historical records may contain incomplete fields, naming variations, reused or inconsistent identifiers, facility-name changes, \$0.00 listings, or records later changed or removed.

Facility-Specific Synthesis

Hafer Park / A C Caplinger Sports Complex shows a substantial long-term USSSA baseball activity footprint in the report. The conservative direct view totals **\$1,242,418.00** across 8,995 teams. The report separately identifies **\$52,712.00** in associated multi-facility activity, producing a combined documented footprint of **\$1,295,130.00**. No softball Calculated Team Entry Fees are displayed.

The highest individually labeled direct season is 2005 at \$91.50K. Direct activity is concentrated in Edmond, and Terri Jungels is the largest director concentration displayed. The report also identifies 932 league teams and \$28,509.00 in League Team Entry Fees.

The public dataset does not establish who actually collected the calculated amounts, how multi-site funds were allocated, what expenses were incurred, whether local fees differed from posted fees, or what tax treatment applied. The strongest use of the report is therefore as a structured facility-level research record that separates documented fact, calculated activity, analytical inference, and conclusions requiring independent verification.
