Evidentiary rule: Calculated Team Entry Fees are Number of Participating Teams x Publicly Posted Team Entry Fee. They are not, by themselves, proof of actual collections, facility or municipal revenue, director compensation, profit, taxable income, or disposition of funds.

Executive Summary

The report identifies **Jenks Youth Baseball Complex** as the Primary Facility. Stand-alone records display **\$1,489,318.00** in Calculated Team Entry Fees: **\$1,453,658.00 baseball** and **\$35,660.00 softball**. The direct population contains **9,127 teams**, **21,507 minimum games**, **1,450,840 minimum officials** as displayed, 11 directors, two municipalities, and one county. League activity includes **448 league teams** with **\$0.00** in publicly displayed League Team Entry Fees.

Director and Municipality Concentration

Page 1 is concentrated in **Jenks at approximately \$1.48M**, with \$4.77K associated with Tulsa. The director chart is led by **Lynn Gibson at approximately \$1.02M**, followed by Bo Morris (\$166.42K), Mike Deviance (\$146.96K), Wally Fortuna (\$78.38K), Ted Cox (\$35.56K), Michael Sanders (\$19.63K), Marie Gassaway (\$10.68K), Cathleen Henderson (\$8.19K), Susan Gibson (\$3.74K), Ebon Walls (\$2.21K), and Alisa Rotert (\$1.89K). These are activity concentrations, not findings of income or receipt of funds.

The highest individually displayed total season is **2023 at \$220.42K**, also the highest displayed baseball season. The highest displayed softball season is **2016 at \$9.42K**. The report's baseball chart also displays 2006 (\$35.27K), 2005 (\$58.22K), and 2004 (\$47.90K), while the total chart aggregates some activity into an **Others** category of \$141.39K. Those component seasons should not be inferred from the total chart.

League Activity and \$0.00 Fee Limitation

The direct population contains **448 league teams** while the publicly displayed League Team Entry Fee total is **\$0.00**. Under the report methodology, this documents participation but does not establish whether a local fee existed or was collected; an unsupported fee must not be imputed.

Associated Multi-Facility / Satellite Activity

Page 3 excludes the stand-alone Primary Facility population and reports **\$2,043,804.00** in associated multi-facility Calculated Team Entry Fees: **\$1,978,230.00 baseball** and **\$65,574.00 softball**. It displays **11,485 teams**, **27,115 minimum games**, **1,886,400 minimum officials**, 20 facility/facility-combination categories, 12 directors, 14 municipality categories, and four counties.

Association is not allocation. Each multi-facility amount is one pool of Calculated Team Entry Fee activity associated with the complete configuration. The report does not establish how teams, games, officials, fees, or other activity were distributed among individual locations.

Page 3 director activity is led by Lynn Gibson (\$1.45M), followed by Bo Morris (\$166.42K), Mike Deviance (\$146.96K), Wally Fortuna (\$112.19K), Rick Glasser (\$54.27K), Ted Cox (\$35.56K), Susan Gibson (\$21.69K), Michael Sanders (\$19.63K), Cathleen Henderson (\$18.31K), Marie Gassaway (\$12.52K), Ebon Walls (\$2.21K), and Alisa Rotert (\$1.89K).

Combined Documented Facility Activity Footprint

Page 4 combines direct stand-alone records with the associated population. The broadest documented footprint is **\$2,068,590.00** in Calculated Team Entry Fees: **\$1,978,230.00 baseball** and **\$90,360.00 softball**. It contains **11,638 teams**, **27,548 minimum games**, **1,913,400 minimum officials**, 21 facility/facility-combination categories, 12 directors, 14 municipality categories, and four counties.

The combined municipality chart is led by **Jenks at approximately \$1.52M**, followed by Jenks/Sand Springs (\$302.33K) and Glenpool/Jenks (\$110.91K). The combined director chart remains led by Lynn Gibson at approximately \$1.45M, followed by Bo Morris (\$166.42K), Mike Deviance (\$146.96K), Wally Fortuna (\$112.19K), Rick Glasser (\$54.27K), Michael Sanders (\$39.63K), Ted Cox (\$35.56K), Susan Gibson (\$26.48K), Cathleen Henderson (\$18.31K), Marie Gassaway (\$12.52K), Ebon Walls (\$2.21K), and Alisa Rotert (\$1.89K).

Methodology & Evidentiary Interpretation

Pages 1-2: direct records listing Jenks Youth Baseball Complex independently. **Page 3:** associated activity where the Primary Facility appears within the report's satellite/multi-facility population. **Page 4:** the combined documented footprint. The report expressly warns that Page 4 is not proof that every dollar, team, game, or official occurred exclusively at the Primary Facility.

Calculated Team Entry Fees measure documented team participation multiplied by publicly displayed team entry fees. They do not, without independent financial evidence, establish actual collections, facility or municipal revenue, director compensation, profit, taxable income, bank deposits, gate or concession revenue, or disposition of funds. Separate facility reports should not simply be summed because the same multi-facility event may appear in multiple facility reports; statewide totals require event-level deduplication.

Facility-Specific Synthesis

Jenks Youth Baseball Complex has a documented direct population of **\$1,489,318.00** in Calculated Team Entry Fees across 9,127 teams, dominated by baseball (\$1,453,658.00) with \$35,660.00 in softball. The direct view is concentrated in Jenks and led by Lynn Gibson in the director chart. The highest individually displayed direct season is 2023 at \$220.42K.

The report's associated population is materially larger than the direct stand-alone population, displaying **\$2,043,804.00** in Calculated Team Entry Fees across 11,485 teams and 20 facility categories. Page 4's combined documented footprint is **\$2,068,590.00** across 11,638 teams, 14 municipality categories, and four counties. These broader figures must be interpreted under the controlling rule that association does not establish allocation.

The 448 league teams paired with a \$0.00 publicly displayed League Team Entry Fee total are a material qualification. The public dataset establishes participation but does not establish whether local fees existed, were collected, or how any such funds were handled.
