The quantitative report displays **\$767,637 in Total Calculated Team Entry Fees**, all categorized as **softball**, with baseball displaying \$0. It also displays **1,267 teams**, **64 divisions of play**, **4,203 minimum games played**, and **8,174 minimum required officials**.

Tournament, League & \$0.00-Fee Methodology

The broader Hidden Valley dataset includes both tournament and league activity. Some league records may document teams, divisions, dates, directors, facilities, locations and other operational information while displaying a **\$0.00 Team Entry Fee**. A \$0.00 publicly reported Team Entry Fee means the public USSSA information captured in the dataset did not identify a Team Entry Fee for that record; it does not necessarily mean no operational activity occurred.

Participating Teams x Publicly Posted Team Entry Fee = Calculated Team Entry Fees. Calculated Team Entry Fees are not USSSA-reported aggregate revenue, director income, personal compensation, profit, taxable income, net proceeds, or audited financial statements.

2018 is the largest displayed season at \$224,165, followed by 2019 at \$162,000 and 2017 at \$149,250. The supplied history identifies November 2018 as the end of McDowell's documented national USSSA executive tenure. The sources do not establish from this timing alone that the \$224,165 was received by McDowell or was financially attributable to his executive position.

Oklahoma City is the largest individually displayed municipality classification at \$173,197. Combined geographic classifications are preserved as one activity pool and are not duplicated across every named location. These figures are not municipal revenue.

Bouse Sports Complex - \$141,855 is the largest individually displayed named facility classification. Multi-facility amounts represent one pool of Calculated Team Entry Fee activity associated with the displayed configuration and should not be independently attributed in full to every facility listed.

Oklahoma County is the largest county classification at \$348,802. Combined county classifications remain intact rather than being duplicated across each county.

National Leadership Context vs. Dataset Classification

The quantitative report labels the entity “**USSSA Area Director: Midwest Sports Productions.**” That label is retained when describing the dataset because it is what the source report displays.

Separately, the supplied historical material identifies **Jeremy McDowell** as MSP's founder and as **Executive Vice President / National Vice President of USSSA Fastpitch from August 2009 through November 2018**. This report therefore does not reduce McDowell's historical role to Area Director or State Director.

The sources do not establish that every Midwest Sports Productions event in the quantitative profile was personally administered by McDowell, nor do they establish that the Calculated Team Entry Fees were received by McDowell, paid to him by USSSA, or represented his compensation.

USSSA Organizational & Financial Structure

The quantitative report's Page 2 depicts **USSSA National -> State Director -> Area Director -> Tournament Director -> Tournament/Event -> Teams**. McDowell's documented Executive Vice President / National Vice President role is treated here as national executive leadership and is not forced into the lower-level Area Director category.

The financial-flow graphic depicts an applicable online event-payment pathway as **Teams -> USSSA Online Payment System -> USSSA -> ACH -> Event/Fiscal Director -> Tournament Operations**. It does not establish that every tournament or league payment necessarily followed that exact pathway.

The subsequent disposition of event funds is not determined by the Hidden Valley dataset unless independently documented.

Why This Is a National Leadership Activity Profile

The quantitative report displays Midwest Sports Productions within the Area Director structure, while the supplied historical evidence documents Jeremy McDowell in national USSSA executive leadership. The profile title reflects the higher-level historical role without altering the quantitative report's original classification.

The supplied history identifies **Jeremy McDowell as the founder of Midwest Sports Productions** and states that he served as **Executive Vice President / National Vice President of USSSA Fastpitch from August 2009 through November 2018**. This places his documented historical USSSA role at the national executive level rather than merely at the ordinary Area Director or State Director level.

Under the standardized Hidden Valley quantitative methodology, the Midwest Sports Productions profile displays **\$767,637 in Total Calculated Team Entry Fees, all categorized as softball**, associated with **1,267 teams, 64 divisions, 4,203 minimum games played, and 8,174 minimum required officials**.

2018 is the largest displayed season at \$224,165. Oklahoma City is the largest municipality classification at \$173,197, Oklahoma County is the largest county classification at \$348,802, and Bouse Sports Complex is the largest individually displayed named facility classification at \$141,855.

The profile also contains several multi-municipality, multi-county and multi-facility configurations. Those amounts are preserved as single pools of Calculated Team Entry Fee activity associated with the displayed combinations and are not duplicated across each named location.

The central organizational finding is that **the Area Director classification appearing in the quantitative Midwest Sports Productions report should not be used as a substitute for Jeremy McDowell's separately documented national executive role**. The two facts answer different questions: one describes the dataset's classification of the event-production entity, while the other describes McDowell's historical position within USSSA leadership.
