Subject: Bouse Sports Complex - Hidden Valley USSSA Facility Report Summary

Attached is the Hidden Valley - Integrity of the Game USSSA Facility Report for **Bouse Sports Complex in Choctaw, Oklahoma**. The report is part of the Oklahoma USSSA Research Dataset covering 2001-2026 and organizes publicly available USSSA tournament and league information into a consistent facility-level analytical framework. The accompanying facility background identifies Bouse Sports Complex at 1333 N Indian Meridian Rd and describes eight turf baseball/softball fields, a splash pad, and playground.

How Calculated Team Entry Fees Are Developed

Number of Participating Teams x Publicly Posted Team Entry Fee = Calculated Team Entry Fees. These figures measure documented economic activity and are not, by themselves, proof of actual collections, gross receipts, facility or municipal revenue, director compensation, profit, taxable income, distributions, gate or concession revenue, bank deposits, or disposition of funds.

The direct facility and municipality charts associate approximately \$1.78M in Calculated Team Entry Fee activity with Bouse Sports Complex and Choctaw. The director chart is led by **BIG Show Productions (\$942.93K)**, followed by Rick Glasser (\$313.45K), Midwest Sports Productions (\$141.86K), Top Gun Events (\$114.75K), Kim Hatcher (\$60.48K), Missy Jennings (\$53.11K), TJ Millus (\$48.75K), OK USSSA Fastpitch State Office (\$29.07K), Wally Fortuna (\$26.44K), Kenneth Crawford (\$21.80K), Tanner McGuire (\$12.30K), Jimmy Greer (\$8.91K), Tony Taylor (\$3.60K), and two displayed \$0 director categories.

The highest displayed total season is **2025 at \$283.31K**. The highest baseball season is **2023 at \$60.73K**, while the highest softball season is **2025 at \$276.24K**. Softball is the dominant calculated-fee sport across the direct population.

Page 3 - Associated Multi-Facility / Satellite Activity

Page 3 excludes the stand-alone Bouse Sports Complex population. It reports **\$1,359,471** in Calculated Team Entry Fees, including **\$565,696 baseball** and **\$793,775 softball**, with **3,269 teams**, **10,908 minimum games**, **21,212 minimum umpires assigned**, **58 facility/facility-combination categories**, **10 directors**, **45 municipality categories**, and **12 counties**.

The largest displayed facility combinations are **Bouse Sports Complex + EOC All Sports Complex (\$245.91K)**, **Bouse Sports Complex + Firelake Ballfields (\$191.76K)**, **Bouse Sports Complex + Del City Ballpark + EOC All Sports Complex + Little Axe Softball Fields + Southern Nazarene University SF (\$107.31K)**, **Bouse Sports Complex + The Battlefields (\$94.11K)**, and **Bouse Sports Complex + Buck Thomas Park (\$83.16K)**. The associated director chart is led by **BIG Show Productions (\$615.92K)** and **Rick Glasser (\$542.31K)**.

Each multi-facility amount is one pool of Calculated Team Entry Fee activity associated with the complete listed configuration. The report does not establish how teams, games, officials, fees, or other activity were distributed among individual locations.

The combined facility chart is led by the stand-alone Bouse Sports Complex category at approximately \$1.78M, followed by Bouse + EOC All Sports Complex (\$245.91K) and Bouse + Firelake Ballfields (\$191.76K). The combined municipality chart is led by **Choctaw at approximately \$1.78M**. The combined director chart is led by **BIG Show Productions (\$1.56M)** and **Rick Glasser (\$855.76K)**, followed by Top Gun Events (\$239.75K) and Midwest Sports Productions (\$175.61K). Page 4 is the broadest documented activity footprint involving Bouse Sports Complex; it is not a claim that all activity occurred exclusively at Bouse.

League Activity, Geography & Operational Scale

The direct scorecards identify **108 league teams** and **\$19,988 in League Calculated Team Entry Fees**. Direct activity is associated with Choctaw and one county. The associated population expands the documented footprint to 45 municipality categories and 12 counties. These geographic relationships document event-record associations and do not independently establish ownership, employment, contractual relationships, revenue sharing, or financial allocation.

Facility-Specific Synthesis

Bouse Sports Complex has a substantial documented USSSA activity footprint across baseball and softball. The conservative direct population reports **\$1,777,443** in Calculated Team Entry Fees, including \$363,677 baseball and \$1,413,766 softball,

associated with 5,821 teams, 17,374 minimum games, 32,682 minimum umpires assigned, 15 directors, 108 league teams, and \$19,988 in league Calculated Team Entry Fees. The highest displayed total and softball season is 2025, while the highest baseball season is 2023. BIG Show Productions is the largest direct director concentration at \$942.93K. Page 3 adds \$1,359,471 in associated multi-facility activity. Together, the report presents a **\$3,136,914 combined documented activity footprint** involving 9,090 teams, 28,282 minimum games, 53,894 minimum umpires assigned, 59 facility/facility-combination categories, 17 directors, 45 municipality categories, and 12 counties.
