Executive Overview

Update Compared With the Prior Summary

Total Calculated Team Entry Fees increased **\$2,104**, from \$400,847 to \$402,951. Baseball remains \$14,483; softball increased \$2,104, from \$386,364 to \$388,468. Teams increased by 8 (2,299 to 2,307), minimum games by 16 (5,957 to 5,973), and minimum required officials by 26 (9,976 to 10,002). Divisions remain 287. The refreshed facility dashboard additionally exposes league activity as 182 league teams and \$11,572 in Calculated League Team Entry Fees.

Sport Composition

The refreshed profile remains predominantly softball-associated: \$388,468 of \$402,951 in Total Calculated Team Entry Fees is categorized as softball, while \$14,483 is baseball. The annual sport chart displays baseball Calculated Team Entry Fees in 2019 (\$12,010) and 2018 (\$2,473).

League Activity

The Facility Report now explicitly displays 182 league teams and \$11,572 in Calculated League Team Entry Fees. League records can add operational context even when a conventional tournament entry-fee field does not capture the entire activity.

Expanded Operational Modeling

The supplied updated dashboard images add modeled views for annual team counts, gate fees, concessions, umpire fees, event net, event income, economic impact, event-host activity, facility, municipality, county, and stature. These views broaden the analytical context beyond Calculated Team Entry Fees. They are research-model estimates and should not be represented as USSSA-reported revenue, audited financial statements, personal income, taxable income, or proof of the disposition of funds.

Participating Teams x Publicly Posted Team Entry Fee = Calculated Team Entry Fees. A \$0.00 public Team Entry Fee means the captured public information did not identify a Team Entry Fee for that record. It does not necessarily establish \$0.00 in operational activity or prove that no other fee arrangement existed.

Historical State-Level Leadership Context

Historical information supplied for this research identifies Missy Jennings as a former Oklahoma USSSA Softball State Director. The supplied organizational graphic places State Directors between USSSA National and Area Directors and describes State Directors as administering the state program, approving events, and overseeing Area Directors. It separately describes Area Directors as USSSA appointees / independent contractors. Exact dates of Jennings' State Director tenure are not established by the supplied reports.

The supplied infographic depicts a general authority flow of USSSA National -> State Director -> Area Director -> Tournament Director -> Tournament/Event -> Teams, and an applicable online payment pathway of Teams -> USSSA Online Payment System -> USSSA -> ACH -> Event/Fiscal Director -> Tournament Operations. The graphic is explanatory and does not establish that every payment followed that pathway, ownership of funds, individual compensation, tax liability, legal liability, or ultimate disposition of proceeds.
