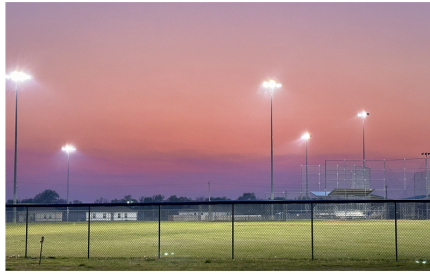

Professional Facility Summary | Hidden Valley - Integrity of the Game | 2001-2026



Executive Summary

Owasso Park North and Owasso Park South form the report's primary-facility population. Direct stand-alone records identify **\$1,288,778** in Calculated Team Entry Fees, including **\$836,411 baseball** and **\$452,367 softball**, across **5,859 teams**, at least **14,806 games**, and at least **27,491 officials**. The direct population includes **17 directors**, one municipality and one county. League records show **293 teams** and **\$48.00** in Calculated League Team Entry Fees.

Multi-Facility Activity & Combined Footprint

Page 3 isolates records where the Owasso primary facility appears within multi-site configurations. That associated population identifies **\$1,026,054** in Calculated Team Entry Fees (**\$944,490** baseball; **\$81,564** softball), **3,183** teams, at least **8,934** games, at least **17,530** officials, **38** facilities, **8** directors, **25** municipalities, and **10** counties. Rick Glasser is the largest associated director concentration at **\$864.69K**.

The Page 4 combined footprint totals **\$2,314,832**, including **\$1,780,901** baseball and **\$533,931** softball. It spans **40** facilities, **17** directors, **25** municipalities, and **10** counties. Owasso is the largest municipality concentration at approximately **\$1.41M**; Rick Glasser is the largest director concentration at approximately **\$1.47M**.

Facility Context

The supplied history describes the complex as two locations: **Sports Park North, 10320 E. 116th St. North**, and **Sports Park South, 10319 E. 106th St. North**. It notes late-1990s quality-of-life investment, 2010-2012 modernization including a 2011 restroom project at Sports Park South, youth-league ground agreements, and 2018 lighting upgrades intended to support night games and regional tournaments. North is described as serving youth soccer, competitive youth baseball and flag football; South as youth baseball, competitive league play and 5K staging.

Methodology & Disclaimer

Calculated Team Entry Fees = participating teams x publicly posted team entry fee. These figures measure documented economic activity and do not, by themselves, establish actual collections, gross receipts, facility or municipal revenue, director compensation, profits, taxable income, gate or concession revenue, or disposition of funds. The Hidden Valley dataset is an independent research reconstruction based primarily on publicly accessible USSSA historical information and is not an official USSSA report, audit, tax determination, forensic-accounting conclusion, or allegation of wrongdoing.

Facility-specific synthesis

Owasso Park North and South show a substantial and long-running documented USSSA activity footprint. The conservative direct population is **\$1.289M** across 5,859 teams. Associated multi-site records add **\$1.026M**, producing a **\$2.315M combined documented footprint**. The combined number is evidence of association with events involving Owasso facilities; it is not evidence that all associated activity occurred at, or was financially allocated to, Owasso.
