Executive Summary

The Reed Baseball Complex in Midwest City is the selected Primary Facility. The report's conservative stand-alone view identifies 1,021 teams, 2,790 minimum games, 5,207 minimum umpires assigned, eight directors, one municipality and one county. It reports \$283,291 in Calculated Team Entry Fees: \$177,170 baseball and \$106,121 softball. League records show 41 teams with a publicly displayed \$0.00 league Team Entry Fee.

The facility history describes Marion C. Reed Ballpark at 2601 S Post Rd, Midwest City, as a longstanding east Oklahoma County youth-baseball hub. A \$2 million renovation completed in July 2022 expanded the complex to five fields and added turf infields, new dugouts/backstops, concession improvements, covered spectator seating, and accessibility improvements.

Key interpretation: Calculated Team Entry Fees are a research measure derived from participating teams multiplied by publicly posted entry fees. They are not, by themselves, proof of facility revenue, municipal revenue, director compensation, profit, tax liability, or money actually received.

Director concentration

Rick Glasser represents the largest direct-facility concentration at \$177.17K, followed by BIG Show Productions at \$71.50K. The remaining direct concentrations shown are Eric Jennings (\$12.41K), Jimmy Greer (\$12.38K), OK USSSA Fastpitch State Office (\$4.97K), Jeremy Woods (\$3.02K), Missy Jennings (\$1.32K), and Marie Gassaway (\$526). These are calculated activity concentrations associated with public event records, not verified income to the named directors.

The highest total season displayed is 2026 at \$79.18K, narrowly above 2023 at \$77.34K. Baseball peaks in 2026 at \$79.18K; softball peaks in 2023 at \$63.35K. The chart shows a pronounced recent baseball concentration in 2024-2026, while the largest softball activity is concentrated in 2023-2024. The 2012 softball record displays \$0, which should not be interpreted as proof that no operational activity occurred.

Associated Multi-Facility / Satellite Activity

Page 3 excludes the stand-alone Reed Baseball Complex population and examines event records in which Reed appears with one or more additional facilities. This associated population totals \$659,706 in Calculated Team Entry Fees (\$493,728 baseball; \$165,978 softball), 1,797 teams, 5,521 minimum games, 10,890 minimum umpires assigned, 40 facility/facility-combination records, six directors, 35 municipalities, and 15 counties.

Rick Glasser is the largest Page 3 director concentration at \$448.29K, followed by BIG Show Productions at \$157.43K and Wally Fortuna at \$42.95K. Midwest City is the largest municipality grouping displayed at \$273.67K.

ASSOCIATION IS NOT ALLOCATION

A multi-facility amount is one pool of calculated event activity associated with the listed combination. It must not be assigned in full to Reed Baseball Complex or divided among the component sites without independent allocation records.

Combined Documented Activity Footprint

Combining the direct stand-alone population with associated multi-facility records produces the broadest documented footprint involving Reed Baseball Complex: \$942,997 in Calculated Team Entry Fees, including \$670,898 baseball and \$272,099 softball; 2,818 teams; 8,311 minimum games; 16,097 minimum umpires assigned; 41 facility/facility-combination records; 11 directors; 35 municipalities; and 15 counties.

Facility Context

The history document identifies the Reed Baseball Complex as a five-field complex following the 2022 modernization. The supplied photographs show synthetic-turf infields, covered spectator areas, modern dugouts/backstops, and the multi-field layout. The history further states that Reed operates alongside the Midwest City Multi-Athletic Complex for regional youth t-ball, baseball, and softball leagues.

Facility-Specific Synthesis

Reed Baseball Complex shows a substantial documented USSSA footprint across both direct and multi-site records. The conservative stand-alone view records \$283,291 in calculated activity and 1,021 teams, while the broader associated footprint reaches \$942,997 and 2,818 teams across 35 municipalities and 15 counties. The most significant direct director concentration is Rick Glasser, and the most significant associated facility configuration is Midwest City MAC + Reed Baseball Complex. The annual charts show the highest total and baseball season in 2026, while softball peaks in 2023. These figures should be used as structured research indicators of documented activity, with the report's allocation and financial limitations preserved.
