Subject: Savage Park - Hidden Valley USSSA Facility Report Summary

Attached is the Hidden Valley - Integrity of the Game USSSA Facility Report for **Savage Park in Tulsa, Oklahoma**. It is part of the Oklahoma USSSA Research Dataset covering 2001-2026 and organizes publicly available USSSA tournament and league information into a consistent facility-level analytical framework.

The supplied facility research identifies Savage Park at **17800 E 21st St., Tulsa, OK 74108**, describes a 13-field softball/baseball complex opened in 2000, and documents a 2021 management transition involving Tulsa Parks, the Tulsa Girls Softball Federation, and Tulsa Little League. Page 1 is the conservative stand-alone view. The facility and municipality charts associate approximately **\$2.73M** in Calculated Team Entry Fee activity with Savage Park and Tulsa. The director chart is led by **Tulsa Girls Softball Federation (\$1.91M)**, followed by HTB Tournaments (\$345.66K), Julie Dingle (\$182.55K), Keith Graham (\$121.38K), and Midwest Sports Productions (\$72.15K).

The highest displayed total season is **2014 at \$274.84K**. The highest displayed softball season is also **2014 at \$274.84K**. Baseball appears only in **2013 at \$4.42K** in the displayed annual series.

Page 3 - Associated Multi-Facility / Satellite Activity

Page 3 excludes the stand-alone Savage Park population and examines records where Savage Park appears with one or more additional facilities.

The associated director chart is led by Midwest Sports Productions (\$38.35K), HTB Tournaments (\$29.05K), and FP National Tournaments (\$14.49K).

Each multi-facility amount is one pool of Calculated Team Entry Fee activity associated with the complete listed configuration. The report does not establish how teams, games, officials, fees, revenues, or other activity were distributed among individual locations.

The combined facility chart is led by stand-alone **Savage Park at approximately \$2.73M**, followed by Carl Smith Sports Complex + Savage Park (\$60.10K) and Sapulpa Girls Softball Park + Savage Park (\$16.71K). The combined municipality chart is led by **Tulsa at approximately \$2.79M**. The combined director chart is led by **Tulsa Girls Softball Federation (\$1.91M)**, followed by HTB Tournaments (\$374.71K), Julie Dingle (\$182.55K), Keith Graham (\$121.38K), and Midwest Sports Productions (\$110.50K).

League Activity, Geography & Operational Scale

The direct scorecards identify **598 league teams** and **\$9,256 in League Calculated Team Entry Fees**. Direct activity is associated with Tulsa and one county. The associated population expands the documented footprint to six municipality categories and two counties. These geographic relationships document event-record associations and do not independently establish

ownership, employment, contractual relationships, revenue sharing, or financial allocation.

Facility-Specific Synthesis

Savage Park has a substantial documented USSSA activity footprint that is overwhelmingly softball-oriented. The conservative direct population reports **\$2,731,173** in Calculated Team Entry Fees, including **\$4,420 baseball** and **\$2,726,753 softball**, associated with **10,877 teams**, **34,305 minimum games**, **65,815 minimum umpires assigned**, **13 directors**, **598 league teams**, and **\$9,256** in League Calculated Team Entry Fees.

Page 3 adds **\$89,243** in associated multi-facility activity. Together, Page 4 presents a **\$2,820,416 combined documented activity footprint** involving **11,166 teams**, **35,469 minimum games**, **67,866 minimum umpires assigned**, **6 facility/facility-combination categories**, **14 directors**, **6 municipality categories**, and **2 counties**. Page 4 is the broadest documented activity footprint involving Savage Park; it is not a claim that all activity occurred exclusively there.
