Research finding

The Wheeler Park facility report identifies **\$19,474 in Calculated Team Entry Fees** in records listing Wheeler Park independently. Softball accounts for \$19,264 of that documented activity, while baseball accounts for \$210. The direct activity population includes 76 teams, a minimum of 179 games and 358 officials assigned. The report identifies one municipality - Oklahoma City - and one county in this stand-alone population.

The highest documented season was **2012 at \$16,630**, entirely reflected in the softball series. The report also shows softball activity of \$1,850 in 2013 and \$790 in 2007. The only positive baseball amount displayed is \$210 in 2004; the 2012 baseball chart displays \$0. These dollar charts measure calculated participation-and-posted-fee activity and do not establish actual collections.

Facility Context & Historical Significance



Wheeler Park is described as a longstanding Oklahoma City municipal athletic site. The supplied history states that the park has four lighted baseball diamonds, with Eggeling Stadium as the anchor field along the Oklahoma River. It identifies the park as a home for City of Oklahoma City Parks & Recreation youth leagues, including OKC Little League Baseball and the Comets Rookie League. The history also describes a \$1.2 million renovation completed in 2019.

Historical notes supplied with the research

The accompanying history places Wheeler Park's establishment in 1903 and connects the surrounding riverfront area with early Oklahoma City professional baseball. It describes the 1923 floods as destroying Western League Park and other early facilities, after which professional baseball relocated while the municipal park was rebuilt. It also discusses the site's segregation-era civil-rights history, the later softball era associated with longtime Parks & Recreation official Albert "Al" Eggeling, and the 1979 dedication of Eggeling Stadium.

Methodology and Evidentiary Interpretation

Calculated Team Entry Fees = number of participating teams x publicly posted team entry fee. These figures are analytical measures of documented economic activity. They are not, by themselves, proof of actual payments collected, facility or municipal revenue, director compensation, profit, taxable income, gate or concession revenue, or the disposition of funds. A \$0 public fee is retained as \$0 rather than replaced with an unsupported estimate.

The facility-report methodology separates direct stand-alone records from multi-facility records and applies the controlling principle **"Association is not allocation."** When several facilities are identified for the same event, the public record may establish that the locations were associated with that event without establishing how teams, games, officials or fees were divided among them. Separate facility reports therefore should not simply be summed to create statewide totals; event-level deduplication is required.

Important scope note for Wheeler Park

The supplied Wheeler Park report contains the direct / stand-alone facility pages and methodology/disclaimer pages, but it does **not** display a Wheeler Park-specific Page 3 multi-facility population or Page 4 combined activity footprint. Accordingly, no satellite-facility total, facility combination, or combined Wheeler Park footprint is stated in this summary. Those values cannot be established from the supplied report.

Facility-specific synthesis

Within the supplied public-data reconstruction, Wheeler Park's conservative stand-alone USSSA footprint is concentrated in softball: \$19,264 of \$19,474 in Calculated Team Entry Fees. The largest season is 2012 (\$16,630), and the largest director-associated concentration is Missy Jennings (\$18,474). The documented direct population includes 76 teams, at least 179 games, at least 358 officials, four directors, one municipality and one county, with no league teams or league Calculated Team Entry Fees displayed. These findings document scale and association only; they do not establish receipt, ownership, allocation, profit, tax treatment, or wrongdoing.
