Executive Summary

The Hidden Valley facility report identifies **Chickasha Sports Complex** as the Primary Facility and separates direct/stand-alone activity from associated multi-facility records and the combined documented activity footprint. **Calculated Team Entry Fees** are participating teams multiplied by publicly posted team entry fees; they are not verified facility revenue, municipal revenue, director income, profit, or money actually received.

For direct records listing Chickasha Sports Complex independently, the report identifies **\$1,370,408** in Calculated Team Entry Fees: **\$452,808 baseball** and **\$917,600 softball**. The direct population contains **4,737 teams**, at least **15,253 games**, and **29,578 umpire assignments**, involving 11 directors within one municipality and one county. No league teams or league Team Entry Fees are displayed.

Association is not allocation. Multi-facility amounts are one pool of activity associated with the complete facility combination and must not be assigned in full to Chickasha Sports Complex or divided among sites without supporting records.

Direct / Stand-Alone Primary Facility Activity

The director chart is concentrated in BIG Show Productions and Rick Glasser. These are activity concentrations in the public dataset and do not establish receipt or ownership of the calculated amounts.

Associated Multi-Facility / Satellite Activity

Page 3 excludes stand-alone Primary Facility records and identifies **\$341,004** in associated multi-facility Calculated Team Entry Fees: **\$73,419 baseball** and **\$267,585 softball**. This population includes **848 teams**, at least **3,328 games**, **6,550 umpire assignments**, **22 facilities**, **3 directors**, **20 municipalities**, and **7 counties**.

Page 3 director concentrations are BIG Show Productions (\$206.31K), Rick Glasser (\$73.42K), and Midwest Sports Productions (\$61.28K). The largest municipality grouping displayed is Chickasha + Oklahoma City at \$108.37K.

Combined Documented Activity Footprint

Page 4 combines the direct and associated populations. The combined documented footprint is **\$1,711,412** in Calculated Team Entry Fees: **\$526,227 baseball** and **\$1,185,185 softball**. It encompasses **5,585 teams**, at least **18,581 games**, **36,128 umpire assignments**, **23 facilities**, **11 directors**, **20 municipalities**, and **7 counties**.

Within the combined director chart, BIG Show Productions is the largest concentration at approximately **\$1.00M**, followed by Rick Glasser at **\$503.53K** and Midwest Sports Productions at **\$142.66K**. Chickasha is the dominant municipality concentration at approximately **\$1.43M**.

Methodology & Evidentiary Limits

Pages 1–2 represent direct/stand-alone Primary Facility activity; Page 3 represents associated multi-facility activity; and Page 4 is the combined documented facility activity footprint. Multi-site records establish association but may not establish how teams, games, officials, fees, or other activity were distributed among individual locations.

Calculated Team Entry Fees are research estimates based on participating teams and publicly displayed entry fees. They do not independently establish actual payments collected, gross receipts, facility or municipal revenue, director compensation, profit, taxable income, bank deposits, gate or concession revenue, or disposition of funds.

The Hidden Valley dataset is an independent research reconstruction, not an official USSSA accounting system, audit, tax determination, forensic accounting conclusion, legal finding, or allegation of wrongdoing. Separate facility reports should not simply be summed for statewide totals because multi-facility events may appear in more than one facility report.

Facility-Specific Synthesis

Chickasha Sports Complex has a direct documented USSSA activity population of \$1.370 million in Calculated Team Entry Fees across 4,737 teams, with softball comprising the larger share. The report shows sustained activity from 2009 through 2025, a 2024 peak of \$184.89K, and major direct director concentrations in BIG Show Productions and Rick Glasser. Associated multi-facility records add \$341,004 in activity involving 22 facilities across 20 municipalities and 7 counties, producing a combined documented footprint of \$1.711 million, 5,585 teams, 18,581 minimum games, and 36,128 minimum umpire assignments. These figures document scale and association; they do not establish allocation or receipt of funds.
